Reading a NIBRS report is one thing; articulating the numbers to those who ask about them is something entirely different. We teach you what you need to know to understand, explain, review, and report your crime statistics correctly. Learn the common mistakes in crime reporting that lead to questionable crime stats. Ensure that your agency stays out of the headlines and free of questionable crime reporting.
